- 2. Minutes of meeting held 19th November 2018
 - Action to carried forward from last meeting. ACTION: Alan to speak to Mary Munday regarding the fungus on the birch stump on the Forstal
 - Minutes agreed and signed
- 3. Finance update
 - a. Reviewed bank balance and recent transactions
 - b. Lloyds banking service was discussed and not considered an improvement on current banking arrangements
 - i. Sarah suggested Unity Banking ACTION: Sarah to find out more details of Unity Bank for discussion at next meeting
- 4. Chairman Parish matters
 - The chairman asked Adam if TEA has thanked Nick Steer for donating Christmas tree ACTION: Roger to follow up other TEA members
 - Grass cutting: The chairman sought approval to increase the payment for this service, should this be necessary. All agreed to maximum 10% increase as the price has been static for 3 years.
 - Upcoming meeting dates: Agreed dates are Monday 25th March for next TPC meeting and Monday 15th April for Annual Parish Meeting at 7.30pm at Throwley Parish Church. The rest of the dates for the year will be agreed after the election in May
 - A letter was received from a member of the parish regarding the arrival of a mobile home at Mr Scamp's field. Concerns were raised by the Council. ACTION: Clerk to write to Graham Thomas (East Swale Planning Officer) to express the concerns of the council and draw the issue to his attention.
- 5. Grant money application discussion
 - Guests joined us for the discussion: Charlotte Shattuck and Keith Steer

- Adam explained the 'You Decide' fund available for local needs and suggested we could apply for funding for defibrillators
- There is a British Heat Foundation scheme to support public access defibs especially in rural areas
- For a £600 contribution they provide:
 - A new model of defibrillator which lasts for 5 years with no additional maintenance costs
 - A secure cabinet and signage
 - Training
 - o A link to the local ambulance service
- There is a cost associated with replacing the pads and battery in the event the equipment is used
- The best location for the equipment needs further discussion due to the dispersed nature of the Parish but the old phone box on the Forstal was suggested
- Adam suggested that TEA could contribute a small donation annually to cover future costs
- All agreed that we support applying to the 'You Decide' fund for this equipment and that the Council will still fund the equipment if this is not successful
- Application deadline is Friday 25th January. The application will need community support in the form of attending a meeting in Teynham at 9.30am on Saturday 2nd February to vote.
- 6. Parish Council Election on 2nd May
 - There will be a lot more communication about this in the coming weeks which Sarah and Roger will share with the Council
- 7. Village Lanes Clean up
 - Agreed date and time is Sunday 24th March at 11.30am at Parsonage Farm. Tim stated that after many years, this is the last year they will be able to host this event. ACTION: Sian to discuss details of catering with Alison Young. Sian will create and circulate a flyer and put a notice in the parish magazine
